

Average learning and development scores in


This dataset includes data from 271 children living in Za'atari and Azrag Camps in Jordan. The data were collected as part of program monitoring efforts for preschool programs being implemented in the camps. The average age of children was 4.5 years.



Distribution of Total IDELA scores

11-20% 21-30% 31-40% 41-50% 51-60% 61-70% 71-80% 81-90% 91-100


On average, children scored 59% correct on the IDELA assessment. There was a large range in children's skills but the most common score was 61-70% correct.



Children in the sample were 4 - 5 years old, with an average age of 4.5 years. Age was significantly positively related to the total IDELA score. On average, one additional year was associated with an additional 18 percentage points correct in total IDELA score.

Distribution of children's gender

Average Total IDELA score by child's gender



50% of children in the sample were female. Girls scored significantly higher than boys on the overall IDELA score.
